

## Microwave Maintenance Checklist

1. **Clean the Interior:**
  - Wipe down the interior walls, ceiling, and turntable regularly with a damp cloth or sponge.
  - Use mild soap and water or a mixture of vinegar and water to remove food splatters and stains.
2. **Clean the Turntable:**
